News from your Shropshire Councillor Claire Wild



436 BUS SERVICE

Improvements are to be made to bus services across the Shropshire Council area in the coming months, along with a fare reduction on both Shrewsbury and Ludlow park and ride.

The improvements to be introduced this year – based on work undertaken by the Council's Transport Group (Shropshire Councillors from across the County) – are:

- Bus service frequency increase on services 64 (Market Drayton to Shrewsbury) and 436 (Bridgnorth to Shrewsbury).
- 401 Oswestry Town service new route added to the existing service.
- 722 Ludlow park and ride (town service) a standalone service to be provided, with an express shuttle from the ECO park and ride site to the railway station and town centre.
- Improvements to the other two Ludlow town services, 701 and new 702
- Shrewsbury park and ride fare reduction from £2 return to £1 return, until March 2025.
- Ludlow park and ride fare reduction from £2 return to £1 return, until March 2025.

For the 436 Service, we will see a new service added within the timetable, the 437, operating between Much Wenlock and Shrewsbury at peak times throughout the day, Monday to Saturday, effectively creating a 30 minute frequency. The 436 contract with Select Bus Service will remain intact with improvements made to accommodate the increased frequency and the addition of route 437. The changes are set to be introduced over a three-to-four month period, from August 2024. The full timetable for the 436/437 will be published prior to September and the start of the school term.

GREEN WASTE SERVICE

Shropshire Council will be introducing an annual charge of £56 for the collection of garden waste from the kerbside and will be keeping all five of the council's household recycling centres open. These decisions follow a consultation that ran from 9 April to 20 May [2024] and asked people what they would be willing to pay for a garden waste subscription, and for their thoughts about proposals to close two recycling centres. The plans have been put forward to help Shropshire Council makes £62m of savings.

A charge of £56 has been agreed as this is in line with the fee charged by neighbouring authorities for garden waste collection, over 80% of local authorities charge for a green waste collection service. More information about the garden waste subscription service can be found on the Shropshire Council website at www.shropshire.gov.uk/gardenwaste. You will also find a list of Frequently Asked Questions at this website address.

The new garden waste subscription service will be introduced from 1 October 2024, with the annual subscription covering the period 1 October 2024 to 30 September 2025. A payment window will be open from September 2024 to March 2025.

Garden waste collections will stop from 1 October 2024 for anyone that hasn't subscribed by this date. From this date food waste collections will be suspended as councils cannot charge for this service. However, all councils in England must introduce a weekly food waste collections to all properties in 2026 and Shropshire will introduce a new food waste collection service by this date. Subscribers to the garden waste service will no longer be able to put food waste in their garden bin.

A Letter from Westminster

Dear Reader,

It is a great delight to be writing to you as the newly elected Member of Parliament for South Shropshire. I want to start by paying tribute to my predecessor, Philip Dunne. For almost two decades, Philip has diligently championed issues which matter to local people. I am grateful for his wise counsel as I prepare to represent South Shropshire.

I grew up in Herefordshire before joining the Army for eight years on numerous operational tours. After this I entered the defence and security industry, operating around the world. I have served in Parliament since 2019 and I am delighted to start representing South Shropshire, where me and my family live in and love very dearly.

I want to thank the people of South Shropshire for believing in me and giving me a chance to be your local representative in Parliament. I am dedicated to being a strong voice for South Shropshire in Parliament and to delivering for our priorities. From supporting our farmers to enhancing public services and from investing in infrastructure to protecting the countryside, we will support our communities and unleash rural prosperity in the years ahead.

I was honoured to play a central role as Parliament met on Tuesday 9 July for the election of the Speaker of the House of Commons. As a newly appointed interim Shadow Deputy Chief Whip, I represented the House of Commons in a ceremonial process where we attend the House of Lords to receive a message from the King asking us to elect a Speaker. We then returned to the Commons and immediately began the process of doing so. In this role, I am responsible for coordinating my party's contribution to parliamentary business - ensuring that, as the official opposition, we hold the new Government to account on its actions.

Since being elected, I have got stuck in at local events in Church Stretton, Atcham and Chelmarsh. Events like these are important for communities and enable me to listen to resident's concerns. I am also delighted that Shropshire Council is set to agree to keep the household recycling centres open in Bridgnorth and Craven Arms, the only two in South Shropshire. These sites will ensure that we can continue to recycle our waste safely and conveniently, with minimal impact on the environment. This decision also protects our precious countryside from issues like fly-tipping, which could have been exacerbated had these closures gone ahead. So, I would like to thank everyone who worked on this campaign to secure this favourable outcome for both local residents and our environment.

There is a lot of work to do, but some of my immediate concerns are for the investment the previous Government promised for Shropshire's hospitals and for road resurfacing. I know this investment is badly needed, so I have already got to work in calling on the new Government to honour these commitments ahead of the King's Speech during the State Opening of Parliament.

I will work tirelessly to ensure the voices of residents across South Shropshire are actively listened to and will keep you updated with the progress I make.

Acton Burnell Castle: A Cradle of Parliamentary Democracy

Tucked away in the tranquil Shropshire countryside stands the impressive yet haunting ruins of Acton Burnell Castle. While its appearance may suggest a formidable fortress, its history is far more intriguing and significant than its outward appearance implies.

A Power Player's Home

Built between 1284 and 1293 by Robert Burnell, Bishop of Bath and Wells and a close confidant of King Edward I, Acton Burnell was more of a fortified manor house than a traditional castle. Its imposing stature was likely a statement of power rather than a defensive necessity.

The Burnell family had been rooted in the Shropshire area for centuries, but it was Robert's rise to prominence as the King's Lord Chancellor that elevated the family's status. His influence is evident in the castle's construction, which utilized the local red sandstone and showcased architectural advancements of the time.

Birthplace of a Parliament

However, Acton Burnell's most enduring legacy lies not in its architecture but in its role in the evolution of English government. It is believed that the first Parliament where commoners were fully represented was held here in 1283. This landmark event marked a pivotal moment in the development of parliamentary democracy.

The Statute of Acton Burnell, enacted during this Parliament, dealt with merchant law and the recovery of debts. Its significance extends beyond its legal implications; it represents a crucial step towards a more representative form of government. While the exact location of the Parliament remains debated, the association with Acton Burnell solidifies its place in history.

Decline and Rediscovery

Despite its historical importance, Acton Burnell's fortunes declined after the 14th century. By 1420, the castle was abandoned, left to decay as the Burnell family focused on building a new manor house nearby.

Fortunately, the ruins survived the ravages of time. Today, visitors can explore the remnants of this oncegrand building and imagine the momentous events that unfolded within its walls. Acton Burnell Castle stands as a poignant reminder of England's rich history and the gradual evolution of its political system.

Speeding on Emstrey Bank

At our last meeting, the Chair officially expressed the sincere condolences of the parish council to all those affected by the recent road traffic accident outside Salop Leisure. Although the causes of the accident are yet to be confirmed, and likely to be complex, this dreadful collision does emphasise the considerable dangers of this stretch of road. The parish council is actively involved in trying to have measures implemented that would reduce the average speed of vehicles exiting the traffic island, and hopefully all the way to Atcham. This will involve Highways England as well as Shropshire Council. We will keep you informed of progress.

Planning applications

When a local planning application is submitted, the parish council is invited as a statutory consultee to comment on it. This will often involve (as it did at our last meeting) listening to the input of residents who come to our meetings to express their views. However, any resident can submit their own comments individually as well – just search for 'Shropshire Council Planning Portal' online. Here you can view the full planning application and all other comments, and follow the progress of any application.

Flu Vaccination Campaign 2024/25

We are preparing for another big year with our annual Flu vaccination campaign.

Flu vaccines will be offered to the following patient groups in order of priority:

- Patients aged 65 years and over
- Patients who are immunosuppressed
- Close contacts of immunocompromised individuals
- Those aged 6 months to under 65 years in clinical risk groups
- Pregnant women
- Carers
- Housebound patients
- Patients' living in long-stay residential care homes or nursing homes
- Frontline workers working in social care settings

We would like to encourage all eligible patients to take up the offer of being vaccinated against influenza.

We have approximate delivery dates for our Flu Vaccines in September and October with **provisional** dates* for our main flu clinics, to be held once again at William Brookes School, Much Wenlock, as follows:

Saturday 5 October Saturday 19 October Saturday 26 October

*Please note these dates may alter subject to flu and covid vaccine availability.

Eligible patients will be contacted by text message once the flu clinics are available to book. The text message will include a "**Self-book"** link. The link expires within 7 days so do ensure you click on the link at your earliest convenience to book your appointment. It is important to ensure we have the correct mobile phone number for you as we will be notifying patients by text message in the first instance when the appointments are on the appointment system.

Flu vaccinations appointments will also be available to book via Patient Online Access. If you have not yet registered for online access, please collect a registration form from one of the Practices.

Covid Booster Vaccinations

It is very likely that we will be delivering COVID booster vaccines alongside the flu vaccinations. We are awaiting further guidance, information and clarification from the NHS on how they plan to deliver the vaccinations this year.

- that your containers were out on the right day.
- that your containers were out by 7am
- that your containers were out in the correct place
- that your lid was closed and no extra waste was next to your bin
- that the correct waste was in the containers

Shropshire Council will investigate the incident and if your collection has genuinely been missed they will come back and collect it within two working days.




